

## CONCLUSION

The convictions in Case No. 1:04-cr-165, as produced by the Western District of Michigan, on charges known to be false, were relentlessly pursued in this case with unclean hands, and even substantially altered charges before jury deliberation. They were secured in a tainted venue in the absence of all reasonable due process. This was a trial by ambush, tying the hands of the accused and preventing key evidence and witnesses, with well orchestrated maneuvers by court officials to "win at all costs".

As the result, Appellant, Janet Marcusse, urges that the indictment be dismissed; the verdicts, convictions, and sentences be vacated. Should a new trial be ordered, Appellant requests pre-trial release so she can prepare a meaningful defense. Appellant also requests an impartial judge in a different venue where her personal safety can be assured, and the prosecutors are constrained by reasonable moral ethics.
